Robert's creative bases are the Byron/Tweed region, Perth WA, and Miami Florida (pre-covid). He has danced with numerous companies and artists including: Stephanie Lake Company, Tasdance, Jukstapoz, STRUT Dance WA, Shaun Parker & Co, Gabrielle Nankivell, and Liesel Zink. He has toured Australia, Europe, the Middle East, and the USA in his role as a freelancing and independent artist.
